Greetings Department of France,

I write this just prior to my departure for the 2nd DEC in St. Avold France. There is a lot on my mind right now. We recently attended the National Convention for The American Legion in New Orleans in August. I also attended the Commanders and Adjutant's Fall Meeting in Indianapolis earlier this month. Each time I attend one of these meetings, I learn a great deal about our organization.

For "Be the One", I learned that just since 9/11 we have lost over 135,000 veterans to suicide. This is way more than the war dead we lost from the Korean War, the Vietnam War, Desert Storm, Iraqi Freedom and the 20 years we spent in Afghanistan, all COMBINED!

Be the One, first, I would like to say that I was touched by the training I received at the Be the One Symposium prior to the start of the National Convention. There were many speakers, but the one who touched me the most was a young man named Kevin Heins. You see, Kevin is one of the only five individuals who survived jumping off of the Golden Gate Bridge in San Francisco and lives to talk about his story. You can see his Youtube story on

We learned what it means to be the One. It is not a motto, it is a way of life. How many friends have you lost to suicide? I have lost several, a couple I spoke with shortly before they committed the act. One was the hardest funeral I've ever attended; I thought it was going to be a closed

casket, it was not and my knees buckled beneath me when I saw him and my friends had to help me out of there.

The Columbia University has come up with six questions for one to ask a friend, partner, college, kids... whoever you think is in the mind to take their own life. These six questions can be found inside the "Be the One" App that can be downloaded on your iPhone or Android phone so you have them at hand all of the time with you. The App is great, it asks you a few questions like are you over 18, are you considering suicide or someone else? It knows your location to pass to the authorities and it guides you through the six questions to gage or rate the likeliness that the one you are talking to really plans to kill himself. These six questions have saved over 20,000 veterans from committing suicide. If someone you know has had a life changing thing happen to him or her like divorce, loss of job, death in the family, this is the one you need to keep your eye on. This is the person who will be depressed because of the things I just mentioned. It must be YOU to walk up and ask a few uncomfortable questions. You do not have to ask all six, you can stop where you think is a proper ending to the questions.

Here are the six questions, In the past month, ...

- 1) Have you wished you were dead or wished you could go to sleep and not wake up? [If yes = Low Risk]
- 2) Have you actually had any thoughts of killing yourself? [If yes, ask questions 3-6, if no then skip to question 6]
- 3) Have you been thinking about how you might do this? [If yes = Moderate Risk]
- 4) Have you had these thoughts and had some intention of acting on them? [If yes indicates a High Risk]
- 5) Have you started to work out or worked out the details of how to kill yourself? Did you intend to carry out this plan? [If yes indicates a High Risk]
- 6) Have you ever done anything, started to do anything, or prepared to do anything to end your life? [If no it indicates a moderate Risk, If yes indicates a High Risk]

If "YES" to any high-risk questions requires further evaluation and possible safety precautions. More on this important topic can be found at WWW.CSSRS.COLUMBIA.EDU.

HOT TOPICS:

1. My email address: If you have and/or are using Adjutant.DFR@outlook.com, do not use it. Delete it. Any email sent to that email address goes to an unmonitored email box. I might not see it for months.

2. The correct abbreviation for the Department of France is DFR. That stands for the Department of FRance. Please do not use DOF or DoF.

Certification of Officers: Thank you to the Posts who have recently held elections and sent in the Notification forms. I can add all Post Officers to the Post Officers Roster on myLegion.org. Reminder, after Post elections or a change in Post Officers, it is required to send two forms to the Department Adjutant.

1.Notification of Post/Squadron Commanders & Adjutants: This form must be sent to the Department Adjutant immediately (within 24 hours) after Post elections. The form should be dated the date of the elections/appointment.

2.Post Officer Certification of Service Form: This form has been revised and sent to all Posts. It needs to be forwarded to the Department Adjutant as soon as possible after Post elections (within 15 days). The Effective Date of Election of Appointment is the date of the original election or

appointment. For example, if an Officer was elected on 1 May 2023 and reelected on 1 May 2024, the Effective Date block will show 1 May 2023.

These forms are critical to keep the current Post Officer informed of Department news. If I do not have the correct information, your Post may not receive vital information.

Please contact me for any questions or if you need the forms.



This article is not going to be so much about the Riders but directed at the Department Vice Commanders and Post Commanders.

American Legion Rider Our program is small, most Posts in the States have membership far exceeding what we have at the Department level. That does not change the fact that we must function as a Department program. If. as Department Vice Commanders or as Post Commander, you have a Post, even with one or two Riders, these Posts must follow certain protocols. I'm

seeing cases where within a Post an individual(s) are establishing what they consider a Chapter and wearing the American Legion Riders patch.

There are certain steps that must be followed before they are considered a Post Chapter. Just to get started, they must;

- The Post must vote on establishing a Chapter within the Post, the vote must be recorded in the GMM minutes
- The minutes of that meeting must be forwarded to the Department Rider Director for approval
- There are Department SOP's that must be complied with to have an approved Chapter.

This is just a very wide brush stroke where this needs to be completed and followed before the member in your Post can sew that American Legion Riders patch on their back and call themselves a Chapter.

As we head into the winter months and things slow down I will be giving more attention to the

Department Rider program. Post Commanders, if you have a member of your Post wearing American Legion Rider patch and the minimum steps have not been complied with or taken, you are responsible and will need to explain to the Department body why you are letting this happen and either take the steps to have a proper Chapter established or have that person(s) discontinue wearing that patch.

I ask everyone's help, Department Vice Commanders and Post Commanders, to help get our program in order and adhere to the rules that govern this program.

If the Post Commanders or members of their respective Post require help and guidance with this, please do not hesitate to ask. Be safe, ride safe and most important watch out for the other guy (or girl). Jim Brotherton Department Rider Director.

New World War II Memorial Iroquois Ambulance Corps (IAC)

Paris Post 1 would like to extend a special thank you and congratulations to everyone involved in the creation of a new American memorial commemorating the courage and spirit of the volunteer ambulance services from World War II.

The extraordinary work and dedication in the creation of this new American memorial in Ville-d'Avray honoring the volunteer ambulance drivers from the

Iroquois Ambulance Corps (IAC), the American Field Service (AFS) and the American Volunteer Ambulance Corps (AVAC) is a testament to the continuity of the courage and spirit that was alive during that horrific period in World War II.

The family legacies of these volunteers has been brought together with the culmination of this new memorial through the dedication and hard work of their descendants and their key partners including the city of Villed'Avray.

Lead by one of these descendants, who is a Legionnaire at Paris Post 1, Larry Winter Roeder Jr. was instrumental in ensuring this new memorial was created. He is the son of Larry Winter Roeder who drove for the American Field Service. Larry grew up listening to his father's stories of his time as a volunteer ambulance driver, and how it drove his father to continue serving his country.

After compiling family histories of the volunteer ambulance drivers throughout his lifetime, Larry decided to take his history preservation a step further by creating a new American memorial in France. He started to reach out to local government officials, institutes of higher education and community associations like Paris Post 1 to coordinate for research, logistics for the new memorial collaboration for the memorial event.



Journey Back to France La Rochelle, Paris & Ville-d'Avray

Larry was grateful to receive a lot of support from many in France who understand the importance of saving this history. Many of the legacies of these heroes are unknown or are not available on the internet.

From La Rochelle to Paris to Villed'Avray, the interest and support for this special history preservation project grew!

After about a year of planning, and many months of intense work, the creation and approval to place the new memorial plaque in Ville-d'Avray was coming together.

When Larry and his wife Nancy first arrived in France, they first went to La Rochelle where Larry's aunt, Josephine Winter Porter, had driven several times with wounded. While in La Rochelle, Larry met with the city maire Jean-François Fountaine to discuss the important history of volunteer ambulance drivers with his community.
