to the hotel from the train station well in advance a couple of days prior with your estimated arrival data at the train station.

Your Room Reservation cost will include Room, Breakfast, Dinner, usage of the Meeting Room, Bus ride on Saturday lunch time tour to Margraten ABMC American War Cemetery and a Department Convention Coin per Hotel guest. Payments for your Room Reservation can only be made in Euros through an IBAN Bank to Bank Transfer. Details are in the Registration Form. What your room cost does not include is lunch on Friday and Saturday. Friday, Post NLO1 will be doing a massive BBQ for everyone, the cost is only 25 Euros cash, and Saturday you will be provided a bag lunch to take with you on the bus for the Margraten tour. The cost for the bag lunch will be 10 Euros cash before boarding the bus. If you choose to eat your lunch at the wonderful restaurant, you may charge the meal to the Hotel to pay during your check out. For Drinks you will be given a Drink Card (think about Credit Card size). Each drink you wish to purchase you must show your drink card, the hotel staff will scan your card and accept your payment during your hotel checkout on the 15th of June.

The Convention hotel reservation forms have been sent out to all Department Officers and Post Commanders and Adjutants. If you are going to be a Delegate for your Post, then please get with your Post leadership for the registration form. The deadline to make your hotel reservation through me, Commander Owens is BEFORE the 25th of April 2025. On the 1st of May, we must give back all of the rooms, if any, that were not reserved by us back to the hotel to give them enough time to be able to sell them during our convention time frame if we are not going to use them. Please do not contact the hotel directly or use a booking website, only go through me using that registration form provided to your Post leadership. It is very possible to attend the meetings and dinners including the Saturday evening Banquet even if you are not a hotel guest. Please see our NL01 member at the sign-in desk as you enter the hotel.





Greeting Comrades,

The Commanders Advisory Committee Meeting is scheduled for 1400 CET, on 2 February 2025. The link for the meeting should have been sent out if I received it.

Certification of Officers: Thank you to the Posts who have recently held elections and sent in the Notification forms. I can add all Post Officers to the Post Officers Roster on myLegion.org.

Reminder, after Post elections or a change in Post Officers, it is required to send two forms to the Department Adjutant.

- 1. Notification of Post/Squadron Commanders & Adjutants: This form must be sent to the Department Adjutant immediately (within 24 hours) after Post elections. The form should be dated the date of the elections/appointment.
- 2. Post Officer Certification of Service Form: This form has been revised and sent to all Posts. It needs to be forwarded to the Department Adjutant as soon as possible after Post elections (within 15 days). The Effective Date of Election of Appointment is the date of the original election or appointment. For example, if an Officer was elected on 1 May 2023 and reelected on 1 May 2024, the

Effective Date block will show 1 May 2023.

These forms are critical to keep the current Post Officer informed of Department news. If I do not have the correct information, your Post may not receive vital information.

Please contact me for any questions or if you need the forms.



The Four Chaplains: A Testament of Faith and Sacrifice



The story of the Four Chaplains stands as a poignant testament to the power of faith, unity, and selflessness during one of the darkest periods in human history-World War II. On February 3, 1943, the U.S. Army transport ship, the USS Dorchester, was torpedoed by a German submarine off the coast of Greenland. Among the hundreds of souls on board were four chaplains of different faiths: Lieutenant George L. Fox, a Methodist; Lieutenant Alexander D. Goode, a Rabbi; Lieutenant John P. Washington, a Roman Catholic priest; and Lieutenant Clark V. Poling, a Dutch Reformed minister. Their acts of heroism not only saved lives but also served as a reminder powerful of the importance of compassion and camaraderie in times of Crisis.

As the Dorchester began to sink and panic ensued, the four chaplains

exemplified true leadership. Instead of fleeing to safety, they sprang into action, encouraging soldiers to put on their life jackets and directing them toward lifeboats. chaplains understood that they faced an unimaginable situation, yet they responded with unwavering bravery. When lifeboats ran out, it is reported that they took off their own life jackets and gave them to demonstrating others. extraordinary selflessness that would become the hallmark of their legacy. In those final moments, they united in prayer, offering words of comfort and hope. Their commitment to a higher cause transcended their differences. illustrating the profound message that faith, in its many forms, brings people together in the face of adversity.

The sinking of the USS Dorchester resulted in the loss of 672 lives, but the story of the Four Chaplains has endured as a symbol of sacrifice and interfaith solidarity. Their decision to remain onboard, facing certain death with courage and dignity, encapsulated not only their commitment to their own beliefs but also their respect for the beliefs of others. This spirit of unity among those of different faiths served as a powerful counter-narrative to the divisiveness that often emerges in times of war.

In recognition of their heroism, the Four Chaplains were posthumously awarded the Distinguished Service Cross, and in 1960, Congress declared February 3rd as "Four Chaplains Day" to commemorate their sacrifice and to promote interfaith understanding and

cooperation. Their legacy continues to inspire individuals to reflect on the importance of altruism, particularly in a world that often appears divided by differences in belief systems.

The narrative of the Four Chaplains reminds us that while they may come from different have backgrounds and traditions, they were united by a Common purpose: to serve humanity in its most desperate hour. Their actions exemplified the belief that life is most meaningful when we extend compassion to others, especially when the stakes are highest. As we remember these four extraordinary men, we are called to honor their memory by fostering unity and understanding among people of all faiths. Their story serves as a beacon of hope, urging us to rise above division and to act with kindness and empathy.

In conclusion, the Four Chaplains of World War II remain a lasting symbol of faith, sacrifice, and the extraordinary potential of the human spirit when faced with unimaginable challenges. Their actions remind us of the importance of unity in diversity, teaching us that true courage lies in selflessness and the willingness to put others before ourselves. As we reflect on their legacy, may we strive to embody their spirit of compassion and work towards a world where such heroism becomes the norm rather than the exception.

On this federal holiday, Legion Family members honor all those who have served as president of the United States.



Why we're making this change

- To reduce the number of sign-in options Veterans need to choose from just as Veterans have asked us to do.
- To continue to protect all Veterans' information and benefits—and meet the latest federal security standards.

What this change means for you

- After January 31, 2025, you won't be able to sign in to VA websites and apps with a My HealtheVet user ID and password. Don't worry. Your My HealtheVet health portal isn't going away. We're just changing the way you sign in.
- After September 30, 2025, you won't be able to sign in with a DS Logon username and password.
- You'll need to use either a Login.gov or ID.me account to sign in to VA.gov, VA mobile apps, and other VA online services.
- You'll need to use a unique email address and add multifactor authentication (MFA) as an added layer of protection for your account.

Not sure if you already have a Login.gov or ID.me account?

Try creating a new account with your email address: If you already have one, Login.gov or ID.me will help you reset your password.

What to do now to prepare

Create your Login.gov or ID.me account

If you don't have an account yet, we encourage you to create one soon:

- Login.gov is a government-provided account for accessing VA and other government services. Read Login.gov's privacy policy at www.login.gov/policy/.
- ID.me is a private account provider that partners with government and non-government organizations. Read ID.me's privacy policy at www.id.me/privacy.

Both options meet modern security standards, protecting your data and providing access to VA and other government services.

Verify your identity and add multifactor authentication

Identity verification and MFA work together to protect your identity and personal information.

- Identity verification is a one-time process. You provide certain personal information and identification (ID). Verification helps us make sure only you can create your sign-in account—and no scammer can create one in your name.
- Multifactor authentication (MFA) adds an extra layer of security when signing in. You
 set up an MFA method, like an authenticator app, on a device you control. Each time you
 sign in, you'll use a code sent to that device, ensuring only you can access your account
 and manage your benefits.
