- In 2024, the CWF Board of Directors awarded \$852,593\* in grants to 13 non-profit organizations that contribute to the physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual needs of children and youth.

### **American Legion Veterans & Children Foundation (VCF)**

• \$1,564,969\* was received in donations to the American Legion Veterans & Children Foundation.

## **Temporary Financial Assistance (TFA)**

• 69 minor children of 23 veterans throughout 17 states received \$33,783\* in non-repayable cash grant assistance from the national Temporary Financial Assistance program to help support those children's basic needs of shelter, utilities, food, and clothing.
