A BILL

A bill to require hospitals to provide patients with an itemized receipt of treatments performed

Be it enacted by The American Legion Boys Nation Senate assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "Hospital Receipt Itemization Act".

SECTION 2. MANDATORY PATIENT PROCEDURE TRANSPARENCY

A majority of hospitals already have the means to provide itemized medical receipts to patients upon discharge or weeks thereafter.

- (1) Itemized lists are to be set in accordance with current HIPAA regulations
- (2) In the event of fines or errors in itemization, cost are sent to the hospital responsible
- (3) Travel doctors are to wire bills to the hospital of employment
 - (A) Alternatively, if there are issues with hospital of employment, bills are to be wired to the

nearest hospital jurisdiction

SECTION 3. OVERSIGHT

Enforcement of this legislature is to be overseen by HIPAA. Hospitals found in violation of this bill will be under scrutiny of a medical negligence case. Patients

(1) Flat Fine - \$100,000

(2) Repeat Offense Fine - Each hospital is to be fined an addition \$20,000 per offense

SECTION 4. DATE OF IMPLIMENTATION

This legislature is set to be implemented January 1, 2027. During the interim, hospitals are to adjust the necessary procedures to accommodate the new receipts.

SECTION 5. TERMINATION

This bill is to be terminated in the event of a more feasible alternative.

(1) The enactment of a stricter federal bill influencing hospital-patient transparency.

- (2) Statutes of similar effect are created across the Union
- (3) This bill is condensed into the current HIPAA receipt legislature

All bills in conflict with this legislature at the time of ratification are declared null and void.
